Ms Choge is currently working as an expert on Regional Mechanisms at the Peace and Security Department, responsible for coordinating relations between the AU and Regional Economic Communities (RECs)/Regional Mechanisms for conflict prevention, management and resolution (RMs) and the implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding on cooperation in the area of peace and security between the AU and the RECs/RMs signed in 2008.
