United Nations Action Plan to Enhance Monitoring and Response to Antisemitism





Mr. Miguel Ángel Moratinos, Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC), launched the "United Nations Action Plan to Enhance Monitoring and Response to Antisemitism" during a hybrid press briefing at the United Nations headquarters in New York.

The Action Plan, which is focused on the United Nations system and developed by UNAOC, builds on the numerous efforts undertaken by the UN over past decades and aims to ensure an even more coordinated and effective response to counter antisemitism.

In particular, the Action Plan provides detailed recommended actions, including establishing a United Nations Monitoring and Evaluation Working Group to monitor and evaluate the impact of policies and measures to address antisemitism, as well as enhancing awareness and understanding of antisemitism among United Nations personnel.

"Antisemitism is a clear and present danger that requires decisive and unified action. It is our collective responsibility to eradicate antisemitism and all forms of bigotry, hatred, and discrimination," stressed USG Moratinos. (17 January)

The ceremony, held in a special tent built over the gate to the former Auschwitz II-Birkenau camp in Poland, was attended by royalty, heads of states and governments, high-level dignitaries, global leaders, and Holocaust survivors. The Commemoration served as a poignant reminder of the atrocities covered during the Holocaust and the enduring responsibility to educate future generations. (27 January)

The international community observed the International Day of Commemoration in Memory of the Victims of the Holocaust at the United Nations General Assembly in New York. The observance was hosted by Ms. Melissa Fleming, United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Global Communications. Speakers included Holocaust survivors, who shared their testimonies, along with the United Nations Secretary-General; the President of the 79th session of the General Assembly and representatives of Member States.

In his remarks, the United Nations Secretary-General, Mr. António Guterres, referenced the UN Action Plan on antisemitism developed by UNAOC, stating, "The United Nations has long worked to combat antisemitism, through a wide range of activities, including our Holocaust Outreach programmes. And we recently launched our Action Plan on antisemitism, recommending the ways the United Nations System can further enhance those efforts."

USG Moratinos delivered remarks alongside UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres (via video message) and H.E. Ambassador Fu Cong, Permanent Representative of China to the United Nations. The event featured a lion dance, including a lion-awakening ceremony presided over by the UNAOC High Representative and the Permanent Representative of China, as well as a drum and guqin performance and exhibitions of Chinese folk arts. He joined other distinguished speakers, including H.E.
